TAXI INFORMATION FROM THE AIRPORT TO OMNI ROYAL ORLEANS HOTEL:

After exiting the baggage area of the airport, proceed to the taxi stand outside the airport. There are plenty of taxis available. Cost: 1 or 2 is \$36. 3 or more passengers \$15 each. They do accept credit cards.

See the previous information on our website about the various trolley routes. The cost for the trolley is \$1.25 each way, CASH. You can purchase an all day Jazzy Pass for \$3. Even ticket machines are CASH ONLY.

We also found that there is a HOP-ON, HOP-OFF City Tour by double decker bus. Tickets can be purchased at www.CitySightseeingNewOrleans.com. The bus makes 19 stops and tickets range from \$39-\$59 for multiday passes. Phone number is: 504-207-6200.

FOOD

BREAKFAST: There are several places in and nearby the hotel. In the hotel, there is the Rib Room serving a full breakfast starting at 7:00 a.m. There is also a small shop in the lobby serving coffee, muffins, etc. It is a grab and go place. A short walk on Royal Street there is Café Beignet serving coffee, beignets, full breakfast, fruit and muffins, etc. They are open starting at 7:00 a.m. There is also Brennans, Johnny PoBoys and Maspero's.
